## **ON NOW @ DX: EVOLUTION**

From flora and fauna-inspired underwater eco-turbines to mussel-inspired soy adhesives and bird beak-looking trains to breathing buildings, the natural world has increasingly become a source for design innovation.

This exhibition invites visitors into a multisensory, imaginative environment that responds to present-day issues that are affecting design practitioners through a survey of products, things, and solutions.

## **NEW! Biomimicry Design ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY**















This workshop will explore the concept of biomimicry and how it applies to everyday design. Students explore what biomimicry is, using the current exhibition as a point of inspiration. Why do we design with biomimicry in mind and how can we apply it to everyday objects.

Students are given a problem and challenged to create a hands-on solution using design thinking and creative problem solving. Challenges include creating a playground (grades 5-9) or public bus shelter (grade 9-12) in which the design concept is applied.

### WORKSHOPS

## Intro to Design

**ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY** 















This workshop exposes and highlights the presence of design in our everyday surroundings, and provides a basis for understanding the work and the importance of designers. Students explore examples of past and present Canadian design that demonstrates how design thinking is used to spark change and innovation. Disciplines discussed and analyzed include fashion, architecture, industrial, interior, and graphic design. Students are given a problem, and challenged to create a hands-on solution using design thinking and creative problem solving.

## Chair Design

**ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY** 

















This session will introduce students to the world of design by using an everyday item, the chair, as a case in point. Students will be shown Design Exchange's rich collection of chairs and discuss form and function in exploring design concerns including materials, ergonomics and scale. We will also learn how discussing the design of a chair can reflect the social and political landscape from which it was created. We will highlight leading Canadian industrial designers from both past and present. Finally, students will learn to think like designers themselves as they work through a hands-on design challenge.

## Textile Workshop

**ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY** 



















Eco-Fashion, or sustainable fashion, is a fast-growing design concept that moves toward a more socially and environmentally responsible approach to fashion design. This workshop will look at Canadian and international fashion designers who are working in this way. We will learn about eco-conscious techniques, natural materials, and methods of production to develop our own definitions of what it means to be a sustainable fashion designer. Finally, students will engage in the design process and participate in a hands-on activity.

## Intro to Architecture

**ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY** 











This session will provide an introductory look at architecture by examining its guiding principles and relationship to urban environments. Students will learn about form and function through exploring Canadian structures and their architects. Together we will examine advancements in green building initiatives and their effects on developing sustainable urban communities. Students will be challenged to work cooperatively through the design process to create their own commemorative Canadian pavilion for our 150th anniversary.

## Theatre + Design

**ELEMENTARY + SECONDARY** 



















In partnership with Canadian Stage, students will engage in a hands-on workshop at the Design Exchange where they will explore aspects of the design process as it relates to theatre and production. In the afternoon, students will make their way to Canadian Stage for a matinee performance. The points of connection explored in the morning session will provide a more thorough understanding of the performance in the afternoon.

This exciting program is priced at \$35.00 per student, which includes the cost of the morning program at Design Exchange and the matinee performance. Price is based on student groups of 10 or more and includes 13% HST.
